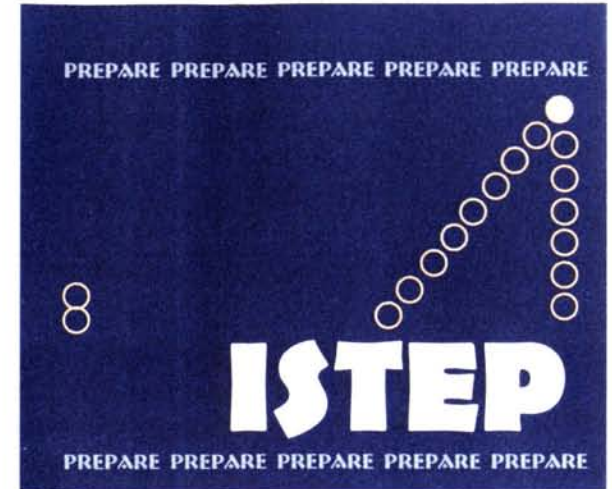

Are you interested in getting the most you can out of your college experience?

... join us for this college transition program, ISTEP, open to any incoming University of Illinois student with a disability. This program is designed to effectively prepare students for their first year of college at the University of Illinois. The program involves both an on-line educational component as well as a one day orientation on campus. This is a great opportunity to learn about university services and also meet other incoming students.

Topics to be covered include:

- Introduction to services offered by the Division of Disability Resources and Educational Services (DRES)
- Overview of academic accommodations for students with disabilities and how those differ from high school accommodations
- How to become an effective advocate for yourself
- Understanding strengths and weaknesses secondary to disability
- Time management/study skill strategies and effective learning habits
- Use of assistive technology/computer skills and how these can help you
- Orientation to college life and UIUC
- How to hire and manage personal assistants, if necessary

Disabilities include but are not limited to:

- Mobility disabilities
- Systematic disabilities
- Cognitive disabilities (such as Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, learning disabilities, or acquired brain injury)
- Autism/Asperger's
- Psychiatric disabilities
- Visual impairment/blindness
- Hard of hearing/deafness
